

## Beck Hopelessness Scale Questionnaire

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The Beck Hopelessness Scale questionnaire consists of twenty true/false questions examining the respondent's attitude for the past week, such as: I might as well give up because there's nothing I can do to make things better for me I happen to be particularly lucky and I expect to get more of the good things in life than the average person

The Beck Hopelessness Scale (BHS) is a questionnaire in which a patient answers "true" or "false" to a series of 20 statements that test his or her feelings about the future. The purpose of completing the questionnaire is to determine the likelihood that a particular person will attempt suicide.

Methods: The Beck Hopelessness Scale, reasons for living inventory, and the suicide behaviour questionnaire were applied in patients with suicide risk attending the psychiatric clinic and the emergency department. A new assessment was made 30 days later to determine the predictive validity of suicide or suicide attempt.

The Beck Hopelessness Scale is a self-report inventory of 20 items. It has become incredibly prevalent across several fields but is particularly useful in psychotherapeutic efforts. Because it is a self-report inventory, an individual can purchase and take the test him or herself.

Beck Hopelessness Scale (BHS) The BHS is composed of 20 dichotomous " true/false " items that aimed to assess three major aspects of hopelessness: feelings about the future, loss of motivation, and expectations. Total scores were created by first reverse-coding nine items (items 1, 3, 5, 6, 8, 10, 13, 15, 19) and then summing the item scores.

Beck Hopelessness Scale ... Administration of the Beck Depression Inventory II or other appropriate procedure for assessing depression, is urged. In long-term studies BHS scores in the moderate and severe ranges have been found to be associated with significant risk for eventual suicide.

Hopelessness is comprised of two core elements: (1) negative expectations about outcomes, and (2) expectations of helplessness in relation to changing such outcomes (Zhou et al. 2013), and can be measured with the Beck Hopelessness Scale (BHS). The BHS is a 20-item, paper and pencil format, self-report inventory for adults.

The Beck Hopelessness Scale is a self-report measure for adults age 17 to 80. It assesses an individual ' s negative expectations about the future. The measure includes 20 items to which participants respond with " true " or " false. " It takes five to 10 minutes to complete.

A scale considered to be predictive of a potential suicide risk, it consists of 20 true-or-false questions which measure pessimism and other negative attitudes. The HDSQ is a 32-item self-report measure of eight symptoms posited by L. Abramson, G. Metalsky, and L. Alloy (1989) to comprise a specific subtype of depression—hopelessness depression.

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Beck Scale for Suicide Ideation ® (BSS ®) is an evaluation of suicidal thinking that helps identify individuals at risk. It also helps measure a broad spectrum of attitudes and behaviors. Guidance on using this test in your telepractice.

The Beck Depression Inventory (BDI) is a 21-item, self-rated scale that evaluates key symptoms of depression including mood, pessimism, sense of failure, self-dissatisfaction, guilt, punishment, self-dislike, self-accusation, suicidal ideas, crying, irritability, social withdrawal, indecisiveness, body image change, work difficulty, insomnia, fatigability, loss of appetite, weight loss, somatic preoccupation, and loss of libido (Beck & Steer, 1993; Beck, Steer & Garbing, 1988).

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The relevance of a clinical diagnosis of depression for explaining the discrepant relationships of hopelessness and depression with suicidal ideation was studied. The Beck Depression Inventory (BDI), Hopelessness Scale (BHS), and the Scale for Suicide Ideation (SSI) were administered to 1,306 (72.8%) patients with at least one DSM III R mood disorder and 488 (27.3%) patients without any mood disorders.
