Differentiating instruction is frequently the piece of assessment for learning that teachers find the most intimidating, but it doesn't need to be this way. Below is a list of common concerns teachers have with differentiating instruction and some considerations that may help for ease these apprehensions.

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Differentiation is The Key to Assessment For Learning ...
Differentiated Assessment. Differentiating assessments is just as effective as differentiating instruction. It involves more formative assessments than summative assessments. These should be small checkpoints throughout a unit to see how well students are learning material. These assessments provide a peek into what each student knows.

They distinguish between assessment of instruction, assessment for instruction, and assessment as instruction (Chappius, Stiggins, Chappius, & Arter, 2012; Earl, 2003). Assessment of instruction is summative and is especially useful in determining the degree to which a student has mastered an extended body of content

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or set of KUDs at a concluding point in a sequence of learning.

Assessment and Differentiation: A Framework for Understanding
Differentiated assessment is the way by which teachers modify and match assessment with the varied characteristics/profiles of students in order to meet the students' individual needs, thereby enhancing their learning and boosting their ability to show what they have learned. Students differ in their previous learning experiences, readiness, learning styles, preferences, academic standing, abilities, strengths and weaknesses, culture, race, and backgrounds.

Students can learn from each other in

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differentiated instruction classrooms. This approach offers a way to include students with learning and thinking differences in the general education classroom. Teachers need to check for understanding to successfully plan for differentiated instruction. Feeding Forward. In their book, Fisher and Frey also explain that formative assessment allows teachers to “feed forward”—that is, to use assessment data to plan the right types of instructional activities to use in the future.

Formative Assessment Is the Cornerstone of Differentiated ...

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Good assessments include pre-assessments, formative assessments, and summative assessments and these assessments all inform instruction. Begin With the End in Mind. According to Wormeli (2006), author of Fair Isn't Always Equal: Assessing and Grading for the Differentiated Classroom, the teacher should begin with the end in mind. Namely, summative assessments and what we deem essential standards for student learning should drive instruction.
