When writing a performance objective for a lesson plan, include (1) the task, (2) the condition, and (3) the criteria. Task (what): The main part of a performance objective involves a task or behavior. In other words, what do you want students to be able to do?

The framing or copying of lesson objectives is still commonplace today and for many almost a 'non-negotiable'; “ All students will; most students will; some students will ... ” meant that teachers had to record three variations of their lesson aims on to lesson plans and on to the whiteboard.

In a lesson plan, the final destination (identifying iambic pentameter or listing important events in the life of Benjamin Franklin, for example) for your students is the objective (s) of the lesson. To take the analogy one step further, objectives are what drive a lesson. They power it forward.

It depends on what they are used for! Objectives for sequencing a unit plan will be more general than for specifying a lesson plan. Don't make writing objectives tedious, trivial, time-consuming, or mechanical. Keep them simple, unambiguous, and clearly focused as a guide to learning.
