Britain's timetable for granting independence to its Southeast Asian colonies depended on local circumstances. Burma had been pressing for independence from Britain for decades. It became a sovereign republic in 1948. In 1989, Burma was officially named Myanmar (myahn[MAH], its name in the Burmese language.

### Southeast Asian Nations Gain Independence

Early in 1948, Burma (now Myanmar) on 4 January and Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) on 4 February, became independent. Malaya, which had been reoccupied by the British troops in 1945 after the defeat of Japan, became independent in 1957. In 1963 she, along with Sabah (formerly north Borneo), Sarawak and Singapore formed the Malaysian Federation.

The declarations of independence by Indonesia and Vietnam in 1945 were - like that of the Philippines in 1898 - rejected and repudiated by their colonial masters and much of the rest of the world, so they still had to fight for actual "independence" (Indonesia until 1949, Vietnam until 1954).
